

UKH taught me to speak up, to question, to write boldly, and to believe in the value of my perspective. It laid the foundation not only for my career, but for the courage I needed to shape an unconventional path. One that would take me from lecture halls to war zones. From student to storyteller.

When I first signed up for Business Management Sciences, I never thought I would one day be an award winning journalist reporting for some of the largest news agencies globally. At the time I didn't appreciate the thousands of words UKH demanded us to write for our academic assignments every week, but today I am deeply grateful for it. Writing turned out to be a vital skill that I use almost every single

day as a journalist. I have won several international awards for my reporting, including the Fetisov Journalism Award (FJA) for excellence in environmental journalism and Covering Climate Now (CCN) Award for best climate report.

After graduating from UKH, I hit the ground running. I was immediately hired by an international NGO, and I also started freelancing, and volunteering at the same time. It was an intense period of growth and exploration. I also found successful UKH alumni everywhere I worked, who inspired and motivated me at all times.

In 2016, I became one of the few female fixers in Iraq, working with international media outlets covering the ISIS war. This experience opened the door for me to pursue journalism professionally. Over the years, I developed my skills and built relationships across the media world, eventually becoming a freelance

journalist. Today, I report from Iraq for the Associated Press, covering stories that matter, from conflict to resilience and everything in between.

Even though I studied business, the versatility and mindset UKH implanted in me allowed me to combine my academic background with on-the-ground experience. That combination gave me the courage to pursue my passion for storytelling.

Alongside journalism, I have also worked with international NGOs for the past ten years, both full-time and as a consultant, across projects related to human rights, accountability, and post-conflict recovery. UKH was where I first learned to think independently and trust my voice. It empowered me to take risks and follow a path that was anything but conventional. For that, I remain truly thankful.


## THE UKH ALUMNI GIVING PROJECT

### **MEDYA SHEXANY**







Throughout my life, there have been times when I quietly felt that my pursuits were driven more by passion than by potential. This inner conviction particularly applies to my decision to apply for the master's programme in the Department of Political Science at UKH in January 2007. It was my Rubicon moment; my dream of pursuing a master's degree at Salahaddin University had not materialised. Yet, I was determined not to yield to setbacks.

During my undergraduate studies, I had been recognised for my abilities in English translation classes; an area I continued to develop after completing my bachelor's degree, albeit with the limited resources available at the time.

The opening of the first English-style university in the region was, for me, a case of preparation meeting opportunity. Admittedly, at the outset, I, like many of my classmates, struggled to cope with the volume of assignments. This challenge was compounded by our relatively limited proficiency in English. Aware of the issue, the university organised a class to improve our writing skills. By the end of the course, my English had significantly improved; on at least one occasion, the instructor even distributed one of my essays to other



students as a model to follow.

By October 2009, I had submitted my thesis, well ahead of the deadline; an achievement that earned me unofficial recognition as "the first product of UKH" by Dr Othman Tar, a member of my thesis committee. He remarked that I had become the first student to complete all the requirements of a programme at the newly established university.

Fast forward to 2012, I travelled to the United States to pursue a PhD. Upon enrolling in my new institution, I came to appreciate the value of my educational background at UKH; it served as a solid foundation on which to build a more advanced intellectual framework. After completing my doctorate, I focused on academic writing for publication.

In January 2023, I published my first book, State Failure, Power Expansion, and Balance of Power in the Middle East, with Palgrave Macmillan. Admittedly, the book did not bring me great financial returns, but it endowed me with a deep sense of fulfilment and confidence. Motivated by that experience, I decided to write more. I am currently working on my second book, which is thematically related, and I hope to see it published by the end of the year.


